# **MINUTES MAY 15, 2023**

1. MEETING CALL TO ORDER:

#### 3. APPROVE MINUTES:

A. April 17, 2023 Regular Meeting: Motion by High to Approve the Minutes with a correction to Item 5 G.: Second by Yarborough

**4. ACCOUNTING**: No discussion (It was noted that due to the internet being down, financials were not received from the Accountancy firm.)

# 5. CHIEF'S REPORT (BC Justin Hartman):

- A. The extrication tools arrived last Tuesday and Captain Gravelle is working to get the equipment on Engine 61 and Attack 61
- B. All 1 3/4" hose has been received, tested, and placed on the Engines
- C. The VFA grants were submitted and the applications accepted; we will be notified midsummer if the grant will be awarded to the District.
- D. Inspections of public buildings will start with schools, after school is out for the summer.
- E. The Be Prepared Fair with Yuba County OES will be held at the Ponderosa Community Center in Brownsville May 18<sup>th</sup> from 5:30 to 7:30pm.
- F. The BME chassis has a potential delivery date of November 2023.
- G. The water tender repairs should be completed in a week or two.
- H. Captain Gravelle recommended updating the signs on Loma Rica and Marysville Roads.
- I. The date for the burn ban will depend on the weather. It was noted that our unit has the largest number of permits in the State.
- J. Captain Gravelle informed the Board that the Measure K purchases previously approved are slowly being delivered—new fire hoses arrived today and will be in service by the end of the week.

## 6. GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT:

- A. GM Shields noted that a resident made a \$1,000 donation to the District. Funds will be deposited into petty cash for future use for the benefit of the Volunteers.
- B. GM Shields is keeping track of hours worked as requested by the Accountancy firm and the salary paid meets/exceeds the minimum wage requirements

#### 7. VOLUNTEER'S REPORT: (Leno Mota)

A. Red Suspenders Day parade in Gridley is May 20<sup>th</sup>, and then the Memorial Day BBQ at the Lions Club is May 29<sup>th</sup>. The Volunteers would like to be more active at community events. Current PR-type inventory needs to be reviewed to determine if more needs to be ordered for upcoming events.

### 8. DISCUSS AND APPROVE: Engine Repair for 2LR01 (Engine 61)

A. Motion by Yarborough to approve the estimate from North Valley Diesel to replace the engine in E61 with a Cummins block and parts and labor as specified in the estimate, not to exceed \$90,000; Second by High
